In this circle I am you

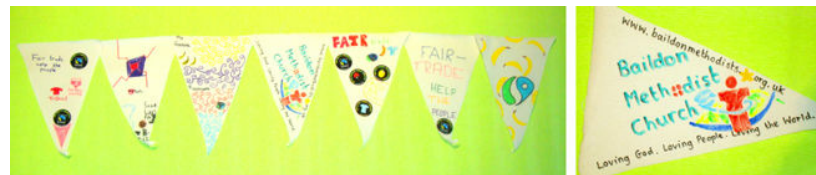

Bunting 4 Justice

You may recall our involvement in Bunting 4 Justice earlier this year. Well, on 14th May we contributed a small amount to a world record breaking line of Fairtrade bunting, when a total of 3.4 kilometres was erected around Battersea Park in London to highlight the campaign demanding trade justice for West African cotton farmers.
